The tehtar (signs) shown above a light blue **ı̇** short carrier are normally to be written above the tengwa for the *following* consonant. The short carrier is only actually used when no consonant follows the vowel, and then of course has the same color as the rest of the text. Of the two tehtar for **e** the dot below is to be used for final unstressed **e** and is written below the tengwa for the *preceding* consonant.
